Purpose:

To improve the quality and effectiveness of advance care planning conversations with consumers, including the process leading to the completion of Advance Directives.

Course Objectives

- A. Identify interview skills for facilitating First Steps®ACP conversations with healthy adults.
- B. Identify interview skills for facilitating First Steps® ACP conversations with adults with chronic illness.
- C. Create strategies to communicate the plan, including the completion of an advance directive document.
- D. Examine the ACP Facilitator's role in implementing three key systems for ACP effectiveness.
- E. Demonstrate beginning competency in facilitating First Steps® ACP conversations through role-play activities.

- 1. Complete the Respecting Choices First Steps ACP Facilitator Online Core Curriculum.
- 2. Complete a practice Advance Directive document to be submitted to instructor for review.
- 3. Attempt to have an ACP conversation with a loved one or close friend. Share in class what you learned from this personal exercise.
