There are some concerns about the agreement proposed by the Town of Lewiston-Woodville to have the Bertie County Building Inspector enforce the town's minimum housing standards.

Minimum housing standards or minimum housing code is a set of regulations specific to the jurisdiction, in the same way as a zoning ordinance, and should be enforced locally by the jurisdiction. For instance, the Town of Lewiston-Woodville has a zoning ordinance that is enforced by the town. Issues with the zoning ordinance are carried before the Town Council. The town also may contract with an agency such as the Mid-East Commission to assist them with enforcement. The consultant, for a fee, would act as the town code enforcement official. The enforcement of minimum housing standards can be time consuming and there could be mounting legal fees associated with those types of enforcement issues, including condemnations. Currently, the county is compensated for building inspections by receiving the fees from building permits.

Another problem with the proposal would be that the county would be responsible for enforcement of standards that are not enforced by the county itself, or in any other jurisdiction in the county. If the agreement was entered into, it could be said that every locality in Bertie County could propose that the Bertie County Building Inspector enforce each individual set of standards, unique to that locality, at the county's expense.

Staff recommends denying the proposed agreement with the Town of Lewiston-Woodville, since Bertie County currently has an agreement with the Town of Lewiston-Woodville, signed in 1985, for the enforcement of the state building code. If the town wishes to enforce local town standards then a town code enforcement official should enforce that policy.

Responses from some other North Carolina Planners on this issue are attached for your information.

#### BERTIE COUNTY ORDINANCE, # 1985-1

ORDINANCE CREATING BERTIE COUNTY INSPECTION DEPARTMENT AND TO ENFORCE WITHIN BERTIE COUNTY NORTH CAROLINA STATE BUILDING CODE AND RELATED LOCAL BUILDING RULES AND REGULATIONS EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1985.

The Board of Commissioners Of Bertle County, North Carolina, Do Ordein As Follows: Article I. Authority For And Purpose of Ordinance.

- 1-1. Authority For Ordinance. This ordinance is adopted by Authority of General Statutes of North Carolina, Chapter 153A, Article 18, Part 4, and other General Statutes relating to Building Safety and Maintenance and to the enforcement within the County of Bertie of the North Carolina State Building Code and related local building rules and regulations approved by the Building Code Council.
  - 1-2. Purpose of Ordinance.
- (a). To provide for the enforcement within Bertie County of the North Carolina State Building Code and related local building rules and regulations approved by the Building Code Council.
  - (b) To create the Bertie County Inspection Department.
  - (c) To provide for the appointment of one or more Bertie County Building Inspectors.
- (d) To repeal previously existing Bertie County Ordinance relating to County Inspection Department and County Electrical Inspector.
- (e) To repeal previously existing Bertie County Ordinance relating to Bertie County Energy and Insulation Inspector.

Article II. Bertie County Inspection Department And Building Inspectors.

- <u>2-1. Inspection Department Created.</u> There is hereby created the Bertie County Inspection Department consisting of one or more Inspectors appointed by the Board of County Commissioners.
- 2-2. Position of Building Inspector Created. There is hereby created the position of Bertie County Building Inspector. The Board of Commissioners of Bertie County is hereby authorized to appoint from time to time one or more Bertie County Building Inspectors and to fix the salary and expense allowance therefor, as provisions therefor shall be made in the annual County Budgets.
- 2-3. <u>Duties And Responsibilities</u>. The duties and responsibilities of the Bertie County Inspection Department and of the Bertie County Building Inspectors in that Department are and shall be to enforce within Bertie County's territorial jurisdiction the North Carolina State Building Code and related local building rules and regulations approved by the Building Code Council, the provisions of this ordinance, and other reasonable and appropriate provisions and regulations that may be enacted from time to time by the Board of Commissioners of Bertie County, relating to:
  - (1) The construction of buildings.
- (2) The installation of such facilities as plumbing systems, electrical systems, heating systems, refrigeration systems, and air-conditioning systems.
  - (3) The installation of insulation.
  - (4) The maintenance of buildings in a safe, sanitary, and healthful condition.
  - (5) Other matters that may be specified by the Board of Commissioners of Bertle County.
- (6) To receive applications for permits, to issue or deny permits, to make necessary inspections, to issue or deny certificates of compliance, to issue orders to correct violations, to bring judicial actions against actual or threatened violations, to keep adequate records, and to take any other actions that may be necessary to adequately enforce the North Carolina State Building Code and related local building rules and regulations approved by the Building Code Council, and the provisions of this ordinance, and other reasonable and appropriate provisions and regulations that may be enacted from time to time by the Board of Commissioners of Bertie County.
- 2-4. Forms, Records and Reports. The Bertie County Inspection Department and each Bertie County Building Inspector shall use forms for applications, permits and records as approved by the North Carolina Commissioner of Insurance and as shall be required by the Bertie County Manager or the Board of Commissioners of Bertie County; shall keep complete records of all applications received, all permits issued, all permits denied, all permits revoked, all stop orders issued, all inspections and reinspections made and other official work performed in accordance with the providions of this ordinance; and shall submit periodic reports to the County Manager, to the Board of Commissioners, to the managers, mayors and governing bodies of the towns the territories within which are placed within the authority of the County Inspection

Department, and to State Agencies as required by law.

- 2-5. Qualifications Of Building Inspectors. No one shall be appointed to the office of Bertie
  County Building Inspector unless he or she shall have first obtained from the North Carolina Code
  Officials Qualifications Board and submitted to the County Manager and to the Board of County Commissioners
  a certificate showing that he or she is a "Qualified Code-Enforcement Official" and as such is qualified
  under Article 9B of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes of North Carolina to engage in the practice of
  Building Code Enforcement.
- 2-6. Oath Of Office. Each Building Inspector shall take an oath to faithfully perform the duties of his office.
- 2-7. Applications And Fees. At the time any application is filed in Bertie County for a building permit or for any other kind or class of permit that is required by the North Carolina State Building Code or related local building rules and regulations, that have been approved by the Building Code Council, the applicant shall pay to Bertie County a fee the amount of which shall be determined as hereinafter provided. From time to time the Board of Commissioners of Bertie County by its resolutions, duly adopted, shall establish a schedule of fees which shall be applicable to and collected from applicants for building permits of various kinds and classes; shall designate one or more officers or employees of Bertie County with whom shall be filed applications for building permits; and shall designate one or more officers or employees of Bertie County who shall collect and receive and issue receipts for building permit application fees.
- 2-8. Inspector Not To Engage In Private Business. No person who holds the position of Bertie County Building Inspector shall engage in or hold any interest in the occupations or businesses of construction of buildings, installation of plumbing systems, installation of electrical systems, installation of heating systems, installation of refrigeration systems, installation of air-conditioning systems, or installation of insulation.

#### Article III. Jurisdiction Within Towns.

- 3-1. Towns May Request County Building Inspectors To Exercise Powers Within The Municipalities. The Board of Commissioners or Town Council of any incorporated town located within Bertie County shall have the right, by its resolution duly adopted, to request the Board of County Commissioners to direct a Bertie County Building Inspector to exercise within all of the town's territorial jurisdiction all of his or her powers as provided by the General Statutes of North Carolina and by the North Carolina State Building Code andby this Ordinance. All such requests shall be made on resolution forms provided by Bertie County and on terms and conditions approved by the Board of Commissioners of Bertie County. Each such town shall deliver three certified copies of its request resolution to the Bertie County Manager who shall then submit the request to the Board of Commissioners of Bertie County. After the request shall have been accepted by the Board of County Commissioners, such acceptance shall be certified by its Chairman and Clerk on the three certified copies of the town's request resolution which shall then be distributed as follows: (1) one back to the town; (2) one to the County Inspection Department; and (3) one to the Bertie County Manager.
- 3-2. County Building Inspector To Exercise Powers Within Municipalities. Upon the acceptance by the Board of Commissioners of Bertie County of a request duly made by the Board of Commissioners or Town council of any incorporated town located within Bertie County the Bertie County Inspection Department and the Bertie County Building Inspector are hereby directed to exercise within the territorial jurisdiction of such incorporated town all of the powers and to perform the duties granted and imposed upon the County Inspection Department and Upon the County Building Inspector by the General Statutes of North Carolina and by the North Carolina State Building Code and by this Ordinance.
- 3-3. County Employee. While performing his or her duties within the territorial jurisdiction of any town the Bertle County Building Inspector shall continue to be a County Employee.
- 3-4. Termination. The authority of the Bertie County Inspection Department and of the Bertie County Building Inspector within any incorporated town may be terminated by the Town or by the County upon thirty days notice given by either to the other pursuant to resolution adopted by the Board of Commissioners or Town Council of the town or by resolution adopted by the Board of County Commissioners.

ARTICLE IV. Existing Ordinances Repealed.

4-1. Earlier Ordinance For County Inspection Department and County Electrical Inspector
Repealed. That certain ordinance designated and entitled EERTIE COUNTY ORDINANCE, #1974-2. ORDINANCE
ADOPTING STATE ELECTRICAL CODE; CREATING COUNTY INSPECTION DEPARTMENT; CREATING OFFICE OF COUNTY ELECTRICAL
INSPECTOR; DUTIES; PERMITS: PROCEDURES: PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY, that was adopted by this Board
on the 19th day of March, 1974, and made affective the first day of April, 1974, be and the same is
hereby repealed.

4-2. Earlier Ordinance For County Energy And Insulation Inspector Repealed. That certain ordinance designated and entitled BERTIE COUNTY ORDINANCE, #1977-3, AN ORDINANCE TO LICENSE INSULATION CONTRACTORS AND OTHERS WHO INSTALL MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT DESIGNED TO MEST THE ENERGY CONSERVATION STANDARDS OF THE STATE BUILDING CODE, that was adopted by this Board on the 20th day of December, 1977, and made effective the first day of January, 1978, be and the same is hereby repealed.

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Adopted by the Board of Commissioners of Bertle County on the first day of April, 1985.

Article V. Effective Date.

S-1. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be effective on and after the first day of July, 1985.

## INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BEWTEEN BERTIE COUNTY AND THE TOWN OF AULANDER

This Interlocal Agreement, made and entered into this the 8<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2009, by and between the Town of Aulander, a municipal corporation organized and existing pursuant to the laws of the State of North Carolina, Party of the First Part, hereinafter referred to as the TOWN and Bertie County, a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina established and operating pursuant to the laws of the State of North Carolina, Party of the Second Part, hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY;

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the TOWN and the COUNTY, pursuant to the authority granted by the North Carolina General Statute 160A-461, hereby covenant, contract, and agree as follows:

- The TOWN hereby contracts with the COUNTY to use the services of the Inspections Department of the COUNTY to administer the TOWN'S Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance within the corporate limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction of the TOWN.
- 2. The COUNTY'S Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance and any amendments thereto are hereby adopted by the TOWN, through execution of this Interlocal Agreement, as well as by Resolution of the Town's Governing Board, and the same shall apply within the corporate limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction of the TOWN.
- 3. The services of the Bertie County Planning and Inspections Department shall be performed at no cost to the TOWN. However, should any claims of any type arise out of the services provided by the COUNTY under this agreement, the TOWN agrees to indemnify and hold the COUNTY, its employees, agents and contractors harmless from any and all claims for liability, loss, injury, damages to persons or property, costs, and attorney's fees resulting from any action brought against County, its employees, agents, contractors and Commissioners arising as a result of the services performed on behalf of the TOWN that are the subject of this Agreement.
- 4. All fees and charges associated with administering the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance as adopted by the Board of County Commissioners, shall be collected by the COUNTY, shall be the sole property of the COUNTY, and no part thereof shall be payable to the TOWN.

- 5. On behalf of the Town, the Bertie County Planning and Inspections Department will use the same degree of effort to enforce the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance as it does for the County, except that if any civil or criminal action becomes necessary to enforce the same, the TOWN shall bring any legal action as may be required to enforce said Ordinance, upon written notice from the Bertie County Planning and inspections Department of such violations.
- 6. This Agreement shall continue until such time as either the TOWN or COUNTY resolves to terminate the Agreement and gives six (6) months written notice to the other party of said termination or upon mutual agreement of both parties.
- 7. This Agreement may only be modified in writing and executed by both parties.
- 8. That the effective date of this Interlocal Agreement shall be February 4, 2009.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Town of Aulander has caused this Agreement to be signed in its name by its Mayor, attested by its Clerk, and its Official Seal to be hereunto affixed, and Bertie County has caused this agreement to be signed in its name by the Chair of the Board of Commissioners and attested by the Clerk of its Board and its Official Seal to be hereunto affixed, the day and year first above written.

Water Project Updates April 20, 2015

Attached for information only, are project summaries for funding application development engagements with Green Engineering which were authorized by the Board in August 2014 following a lengthy work session:

1) South Windsor distribution improvements

(USDA Rural Development financing)

2) System Control and Data Acquisition project

(State Revolving Fund financing)

Both projects are being prepared on an "at risk" basis by the consultant with no cost obligation or encumbrance of County funds. After two unsuccessful CDBG applications, efforts are now focused on USDA Rural Development financing (combined grant and loan packages), plus State Revolving Fund monies with no interest. One of the County's struggles has been the "law of unintended consequences" whereby if the County water system had experienced regulatory violations, or "NOVs-- notices of violations" our grant applications would have scored more points on the rating scale. This has also been the case with the South Windsor Water system which had no violations for its operation in recent years.

At its regular meeting on September 8<sup>th</sup> 2014 the Board of Commissioners approved:

- Mission Statement for Bertie Regional Water System, "To provide the highest quality of drinking water services
  to its customers at the lowest possible cost while protecting the environment and maintaining its assets for a
  sustainable future."
- Asset Management Plan
- Capital Improvement Plan for fiscal years 2014 through 2025
- Back Flow and Cross Connection Prevention Plan
- Operations and Maintenance Plan (with implementation funding in the FY 2014-2015 approved budget)

Additionally, the Board has authorized the consolidation and transfer of assets with the South Windsor Water system. Green Engineering has also been engaged to evaluate the requests from the Town of Lewiston-Woodville and the Town of Roxobel for consolidation of their water systems with the County. Operationally, the Water Department is working toward a July 1, 2015 cutover date.

At the April 7<sup>th</sup> meeting the Board approved an update of the water system hydraulic model with a specific focus on the northwest quadrant near Roxobel which will aid in the system design and installation of an appropriately sized booster pump station to address water pressure issues in and around the Town of Roxobel.

April 29<sup>th</sup>, Water Superintendent Ricky Spivey and I will meet with USDA Rural Development staff to review the South Windsor project.

Forward progress continues!

### 1) South Windsor distribution system improvements (Water District III) USDA Rural Development application:

- Water distribution system upgrade including all meter replacement for 1,326 customers
- District III SCADA works to include master units at Connie's and Ricky's offices, wells 1 & 2 and tank 1,
- Automatic meter reading system for all existing water meters in District III
- Woodard Road water main reinforcements consisting of installation of ± 27,500 linear feet of 6-inch water main.

Project cost estimate: \$ 3,089,801 (seeking grant and loan financing with possible 2.75% over 40 years)

Annual debt service payment: \$ 128,350 which is offset by revenue from system consolidations

-65,280 South Windsor customer revenue

-56,059 Lewiston-Woodville customer revenue

-60.526 Roxobel customer revenue

-53,515 Estimated annual net revenue gain for consolidated water system\*

# Information for Transferring PAAS Software from UNIX AIX 4.3.2 to Windows Server 2012 R2

In 2014 the county received a letter from IBM stating that support and new hardware would soon be discontinued for their RS/6000 series servers. Bertie County uses a RS/6000 server for the Property Information and Tax Collections software, or PAAS. Universe is the database used to store the information entered in the PAAS front end application. The server hardware is over twenty years old and in critical need of updating.

The IT Center's plan is to have this software moved to a new Microsoft Windows Server Version 2012 R2. This will allow hardware support for many years to come, enable us to automate backups of this critical server, and provide better onsite support when needed. The following is an overview of what is involved to complete this upgrade, and also the steps taken to achieve them.

- Purchase a new server for the software to reside. After receiving hardware requirements, a
  Dell PowerEdge Server was purchased exceeding those requirements which included hardware
  maintenance for 5 years. The server has already been setup and configured in preparation for
  the PAAS/Universe software transfer.
- 2. Acquire a new license for the database software. Universe is the database software used to contain the data entered into the PAAS software. This includes all land records and property tax information. Three companies were contacted for quotes to obtain the new license to run Universe on the new Windows Server platform. OnGroup, who we currently pay yearly renewals for the UNIX version of Universe, provided a quote but we later found that they had not been correctly renewing our license and that they had lost their reseller privileges with Rocket Software. Rocket Software also provided a quote but Keystone software came in with the lowest bid, also providing it as value added. At least for the first year this is the lowest cost and best solution.
- 3. Find a vendor to move the PAAS/Universe software and data to the new server. In the beginning the plan was to have GoodPickin' do the entire project. They have been our support for both the PAAS application and the database since we stopped paying Keystone for support in the early 2000's. We moved to GoodPickin' support because of the lengthy wait times and inability of Keystone to fix some issues with their PAAS application. GoodPickin' in my experience has been one of the best vendors I have had to deal with in the fifteen years I have been in the IT Center.

In speaking with GoodPickin' they give us a list of steps that must be completed before the transfer could be made. One of the first steps was to notify Keystone of our intentions. In locating the contract that was signed in 1998 between Bertie County and Keystone Software it stated that if the county ever wanted to move the PAAS software to a new platform then a fee of \$29,000 would be due to them. After having Keystone come and show us their newest version of software, looking at other vendor's solutions and finding them much more expensive, it was decided by the Tax Department that it would be in the best interest of the county to stay

with the PAAS software version being used. Upon relaying those intentions to Keystone software the owner stated that if they were allowed to quote us the entire move then they would cut the \$29,000 change of platform fee to \$14,500. After the quote was received, that statement was retracted, saying that they would only cut the fee if allowed to do the entire project. I also spoke with the county attorney Lloyd Smith about the contract to see if there was any way to get around it. In the end we all felt that would not be in the best interest of the county and that if successful, GoodPickin' or any other company may not be interested in completing the work.

I then tried speaking with IT Directors from counties that have had this project completed, Bill Blanchard from Northampton County, and Andy Muncey from Macon County, both stated that after numerous misstatements and problems with Keystone doing the initial transfer, they had to get GoodPickin' to come in and clean it up and make everything usable again. Costing them time and money over what was initially paid to Keystone.

ARTICLE 9A. LIENS FOR AMBULANCE SERVICE

Go to the North Carolina Code Archive Directory

N.C. Gen. Stat. § 44-51.1 (2014)

§ 44-51.1. Lien on real property of recipient of ambulance service paid for or provided by county or municipality

There is hereby created a general lien upon the real property of any person who has been furnished ambulance service by a county or municipal agency or at the expense of county or municipal government. The lien created by this section shall continue from the date of filing until satisfied, except that no action to enforce it may be brought more than 10 years after the date on which ambulance service was furnished nor more than three years after the date of recipient's death. Failure to bring action within such times shall be a complete bar against any recovery and shall extinguish the lien.

Mr. East assured the Board that the current staff would receive priority. He also stated that Republic Services was currently participating in discussions with Waste Industries about possibly purchasing the current convenience center properties.

Chairman Wesson assured Mr. East and Ms. Aiken that once the suggested changes have been made, and the contract has been resubmitted to the County Attorney, it would be approved in the coming days and would not have to be approved at a formal Board meeting.

Mr. Bland Baker of Coastal Care provided a brief PowerPoint presentation regarding the consolidation of the Area Board of Coastal Care and the Area Board of East Carolina Behavioral Health.

### Resolution of Support for an Alternative Governance Structure for the Area Authority serving Bertle County

WHEREAS, in accordance with N. C. General Statute § 122C 115 (c1), the Area Board of CoastalCare, an Area Authority serving Brunswick, Cartestet, New Hanover, Onslow and Pender Counties and the Area Board of Hast Carolina Behavioral Health, an Area Authority serving Beaufort, Bertle, Camden, Chowan, Craven, Currituck, Daro, Gates, Hertford, Hyde, Jones, Martin, Northampton, Pamlico, Pasquotank, Perquimans, Pitt, Tyrrell, and Washington Counties, have entered into an agreement to consolidate their agencies into a twenty-four county Area Authority serving all previously names counties; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the N. C. Department of Health and Human Services has approved this consolidation, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, N. C. General Statute § 122C – 118.1, which specifies the composition of an Area Authority Board, permits an alternative Area Board structure to be implemented 1) if the total population of the Area Authority catchment area exceeds 1,250,000 and 2) if the counties which comprise the Area Authority agree by resolution to an alternative structure; and

WHEREAS, the total population of the new Area Authority created by the consolidation of CoastalCare and East Carolina Behavioral Health is 1,260,778; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the residents of the twenty-four counties to approve an alternative governance structure for the consolidated Area Authority.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Bertie County Board of Commissioners, do hereby approve the structure of the Area Board and the Regional Advisory Boards of the consolidated Area Authority, as outlined below.

To provide a local presence in the counties served and to assure that each county has input into the services received by its residents, the twenty-four county catchment area will have three regions. The regions have been designed to equalize, to the extent possible, the number of counties, population in the region, and overall square mileage of the regions. The three regions and the counties served are:

Northern Region: Bertie, Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Gates, Hertford, Martin, Northernpton, Pasquotank and Perquimans Counties.

or designee of the regional Consumer and Family Advisory Committee. County Commissioner members of the Regional Advisory Boards may serve for as long as they are a commissioner. Other members of the Regional Advisory Board may serve for up to three, three year consecutive terms.

The primary functions of the Regional Advisory Board will be to advise the Area Authority Chief Executive Officer on the evaluation and hiring of a Regional Director; recommending priorities for expenditure of state and county funds for development of the annual budget; determining local priorities for inclusion in the overall strategic plan; identifying community needs and concerns; monitoring resolution of issues; and monitoring performance at the local level, including access to care, expenditure of service funds, number of consumers served, services delivered, provider network size and composition, outcomes, and consumer satisfaction.

Bach Regional Advisory Board will establish its own bylaws based on local needs, but in compliance with standardized requirements established by the Governing Board for quorums, frequency of meetings, elections of officers, duties of members, committees and committee appointments, and attendance standards. Such bylaws are subject to the approval of the Governing Board.

Each Regional Advisory Board will select four (4) members to serve as the Area Authority Governing Board: one county commissioner, the Consumer and Family Advisory Committee chair or designee, and two other members. In addition, the chair or designee of the Area Authority Network Council shall serve on the Governing Board as a non-voting member. The county commissioner members of the Governing Board shall serve one three year term without consecutive reappointment, so that commissioner representation on the Governing Board will rotate among the counties in each region. The other members of the Governing Board may serve three, three year terms.

The Governing Board's primary responsibilities will include determining policy; strategic planning, including consideration of local priorities as determined by the Regional Advisory Boards; budgets; hiring and evaluations of the Chief Executive Officer; monitoring of deliverables, including overall performance and financial management; government affirm and advocacy; reporting to constituent counties; responding to concerns and feedback from the Regional Advisory Boards; reviewing, revising and approving the Regional Advisory Board bylaws; and all other responsibilities outlined in N. C. law for Area Authority Boards. The Governing Board will develop and adopt bylaws to address its activities in accordance with law.

Commissioner Bazemore SECONDED the motion. The MOTION PASSED unanimously.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Bertie and by the Board of Commissioners sitting as the governing body of the County Water Districts named above, that the attached agreement is hereby approved on behalf of the County and the County Water Districts and that the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners is authorized to sign such Agreement on behalf of the County and each Water District.

### STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA BERTIE COUNTY AGREEMENT

### **ARTICLE I**

### **AUTHORITY**

Without limitation, the following portions of the General Statutes of North Carolina are recited herein as authority for this Agreement:

- 1. "PUBLIC ENTERPRISES II (CHAPTER 153A, ARTICLE 15)
- (a) N.C.G.S § 153A-274. PUBLIC ENTERPRISE DEFINED

As used in this Article, "public enterprise" includes:

- Water supply and distribution systems.
- Wastewater collection, treatment and disposal systems of all types
- (b) N.C.G.S. §153A-275. <u>AUTHORITY TO OPERATE PUBLIC ENTERPRISES</u>
  - A county may acquire, lease as lessor or lessee, construct, establish, enlarge, improve, extend, maintain, own, operate, and contract for the operation of public enterprises in order to furnish services to the county and its citizens ...
  - A county may adopt adequate and reasonable rules to protect and regulate a public enterprise belonging to or operated by it. The rules shall be adopted by ordinance (Emp. Add.)

### (c) N.C.G.S. §153A-277. <u>AUTHORITY TO FIX AND ENFORCE RATES</u>

A county may establish and revise from time to time schedules of rents, rates, fees, charges, and penalties for the use of or the services furnished by a public enterprise. Schedules of rents, rates, fees, charges, and penalties may vary for the same class of service in different areas of the county and may vary according to classes of service, and different schedules may be adopted for service provided outside of the county . . . . " (Emp. Add.)

### (d) N.C.G.S. §153A-278. <u>JOINT PROVISION OF ENTERPRISORY SERVICES</u>

"Two or more counties, cities, or other units of local government may cooperate in the exercise of any power granted by this Article according to the procedures and provisions of Chapter 1 60A, Article 20, Part 1."

### 2. "INTERLOCAL COOPERATION." CHAPTER 160A, ARTICLE 20, PART I

### (a) N.C.G.S. §160A-460. <u>DEFINITIONS.</u>

"The words defined in this section shall have the meanings indicated when used in this part;

- (1) "Undertaking" means the joint exercise of two or more units of local government, or the contractual exercise by one unit for one or more other units, of any power, function, <u>public enterprise</u>, right, privilege, or immunity of local government.
- (2) "Unit" or "unit of local government" means a <u>county</u>, city, consolidated city-county, local board of education, sanitary district, facility authority created under Part 4 of this Article, or <u>other local political sub-division</u>, authority, or agency of local government." (Emp. Add.)

### (b) N.C.G.S. §160A-461. INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AUTHORIZED

"Any unit of local government in this State and any one or more other units of local government in this State or any other state (to the extent permitted by the laws of the other state) may enter into contracts or agreements with each other in order to execute any undertaking. The contracts and agreements shall be of reasonable duration, as determined by the participating units, and shall be ratified by resolution of the governing board of each unit spread upon its minutes." (Emp. Add.)

### 3. "COUNTY WATER AND SEWER DISTRICTS" (CHAPTER 162, ARTICLE 6)

### (a) N.C.G.S. §162A-88. <u>DISTRICT IS A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION</u>

"The inhabitants of a county water and sewer district created pursuant to this Article are a body corporate and politic by the name specified by the board of commissioners. Under that name they are vested with all the property and rights of property belonging to the corporation; have perpetual succession; may sue and be sued; may contract and be contracted with; may acquire and hold any property, real and personal, devised, bequeathed, sold, or in any matter conveyed, dedicated to, or otherwise acquired by them, and from time to time hold, invest, sell, or dispose of the same; may have a common seal and alter and renew it at will; may establish, revise and collect rates, fees or other charges and penalties for the use of or the services furnished or to be furnished by any sanitary sewer system, water system or sanitary sewer and water system of the district; and may exercise those powers conferred on them by this Article." (Emp. Add.)

### (b) N.C.G.S. §162A-89. GOVERNING BODY OF DISTRICT POWERS

"The board of commissioners of the county in which a county water and sewer district is created is the governing body of the district."

## (c) N.C.G.S. §162A-90. BONDS AND NOTES AUTHORIZED

"A county water and sewer district may from time to time issue general obligation and revenue bonds and bond anticipation notes pursuant to the Local Government Finance Act, for the purposes of providing sanitary sewer systems or water systems or both... A county water and sewer district may from time to time issue tax and revenue anticipation notes pursuant to Chapter 159, Article 9, Part 2."

### 4. "COUNTY PROPERTY" (CHAPTER 153A, ARTICLE 8, PART I

### (a) N.C.G.S. §153A-165. <u>LEASES.</u>

"A county may lease as lessee, with or without option to purchase, any real or personal property for any authorized public purpose....."

### ARTICLE II RECITALS

The following recitals are herewith set forth as statements of existing facts and are hereby incorporated as substantive parts of this Agreement;

- 1. The parties to this Agreement are "units of local government" and the subject matter of this agreement is an "undertaking" pursuant to the provisions of N.C.G.S. §160A-460.
- 2. The Districts are county water and sewer districts created by the Board of Commissioners of Bertie County pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 162A, Article 6 of the General Statutes of North Carolina.
- 3. Each of the Districts has, pursuant to N.C.G.S. §162A-90, issued bonded indebtedness, said indebtedness having been approved by the North Carolina Local Government Commission pursuant to the North Carolina Local Government Finance Act.
- 4. Each of the Districts was successful in acquiring financial assistance from the United States Department of Agriculture, Rural Utilities Service, among others, to construct water systems and/or wastewater collection, treatment and disposal systems.
- 5. None of the Districts currently employ personnel or have any means to administer the ongoing operations and maintenance of their systems.
- 6. The County currently administers the operations of each of the Districts and attempts to allocate costs of administration in an equitable and pro-rata basis among the Districts; however, the costs of administration by the County require it to separate operating costs for each of the Districts and that such separation and current manner of operation is unduly complex, cumbersome, duplicative and inefficient.

7. The Board of Commissioners of Bertie County, as commissioners of Bertie County and as the governing body of each of the Districts has caused an analysis of the advisability, feasibility and legality of consolidating the operations of the Districts and, after due and diligent consideration has, in the exercise of their best judgment, determined that it is in the best interest of each District as well as the efficient use of County resources to administer the operations and maintenance of the Districts by consolidating the operation s and management as herein defined and agreed.

# ARTICLE III CREATION OF LEASEHOLD INTEREST

Each of the Districts, as lessors, by the execution of this Agreement, does hereby lease to County, as lessee, and County by the execution of this Agreement, does hereby lease from each of the Districts, upon the terms and conditions herein set forth, all of each District's right, title and interest in and to all water lines, wells, pumps, and appurtenances thereto owned by any of said Districts and does hereby further lease unto County, as lessee, all of its right, title and interest in and to any and all real estate now owned by or hereafter acquired by each of the Districts. It is the intent and purpose of this Agreement that each of the Districts does hereby lease to County, as lessee, and County does hereby accept, as lessee, all of the real and personal property of each of the Districts, subject to the terms and conditions as herein set forth.

### ARTICLE IV TRANSFER OF ASSETS

Each of the Districts does hereby transfer unto County all of its right, title and interest in and to all cash, accounts receivable, contract rights or other intangibles, to have and to hold the same according to the terms and conditions as set forth herein. In addition, County agrees to assume the payment of all accounts payable, cash deposits on hand and any other contract obligation of each of the Districts, excluding specifically, however, the assumption and payment of any bonded or other indebtedness currently payable to any banking institution for funds received for the construction, operation or maintenance of improvements within any District.

# ARTICLE V OBLIGATIONS OF COUNTY

As consideration for the lease and transfer of each District's interest as hereinabove set forth, County agrees to:

- 1. Through the Bertie County Water Department the County will administer all operations and maintenance of the water and, to the extent applicable, wastewater systems within each District. In so doing, County agrees that, at a minimum, the current level of service provided to each District will be maintained.
- 2. Establish and revise from time to time schedules of rates, fees, charges, and penalties for the use of or the water and sewer services furnished and to bill and collect same. It is agreed that any and all funds collected by the Water Department shall be collected and maintained as separate water and sewer enterprise funds and will not be commingled with the general funds of the County but used solely for the operation and management of the water and sewer enterprises.

Funds collected by the Water Department shall be separated into a water enterprise fund and a wastewater enterprise fund so that funds received for water services will be used exclusively for the operation, maintenance and extension of water services and funds collected by the Water Department for wastewater services will be used exclusively for the operation, maintenance and extension of wastewater services.

3. Deliver to each District or its designee for payment, on a timely basis, funds sufficient to pay when due all principal and interest payments on each District's current indebtedness.

# ARTICLE VI COMPLIANCE WITH INTERLOCAL COOPERATION STATUTES

In compliance with N.C.G.S., Chapter 160A, Article 20, Part 1, it is herein specified:

### 1. PURPOSE OF THE AGREEMENT

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide a cost efficient method for the administration, operation, maintenance and expansion of water and, where applicable in a District providing such, wastewater services to each of the Districts through the Bertie County Water Department.

### 2. **DURATION OF THE AGREEMENT**

The duration of this Agreement as it relates to any individual District shall be for so long as such District has outstanding any indebtedness which has been issued under the North Carolina Local Government Finance Act.

### 3. <u>APPOINTMENT OF PERSONNEL</u>

The personnel necessary to carry out the provisions of this Agreement and undertaking shall be appointed by the Bertie County Water Department, subject to the approval of the Bertie County Board of Commissioners.

### 4. METHOD OF FINANCING THE AGREEMENT

The financing of this undertaking shall be by the enterprise funds received for the provision of water and wastewater services as specified in this Agreement and the apportionment of costs and revenues shall be by the Board of Commissioners of Bertie County.

### 5. OWNERSHIP OF REAL PROPERTY

Any real property owned or acquired by any District during the term of this Agreement shall be and remain the property of the District owning or acquiring such, subject to the leasehold interest of the County as hereinabove specified in Article III.

Upon expiration of this Agreement between County and any of the individual Districts pursuant to the provisions of Articles VI and VII, the ownership of any real property currently owned or acquired during the term hereof shall be transferred to the County by special warranty deed pursuant to the provisions of Article VII.

#### 6. AMENDMENTS

This Agreement may be amended by written agreement between the County and any individual District who is or may become a party hereto as to any matters between the County and such individual District; however, no amendment affecting any District who does not agree or consent to such amendment shall be effective as to any such non-consenting District.

### 7. TERMINATION

This Agreement shall be terminated as to any individual District by an agreement in writing between the County and such terminating District; however, the termination as to any such District shall not affect any non-terminating District.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, this Agreement shall be terminated as to any individual District at such time as such District has no outstanding indebtedness issued pursuant to the North Carolina Local Government Finance Act.

### ARTICLE VII OPTION TO PURCHASE

Each District hereby grants to the County an option to purchase for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) all of the real and personal property owned by the District upon the termination of the lease as herein specified and the termination of this Agreement pursuant to the provisions of Article VI. Transfer shall be by special warranty deed and appropriate bill of sale.

Upon termination of this Agreement and acquisition by the County of the properties of the Districts as herein specified, County agrees to continue to provide the services as specified herein at the existing levels of service and as the same may be expanded in the future.

# ARTICLE VIII NEW DISTRICTS

Any new water and sewer district which may be formed in Bertie County pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 162A, Article 6 of the General Statutes of North Carolina shall be made a party to this Agreement upon formation of such District.

# ARTICLE IX NON-APPROPRIATION BY COUNTY

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as obligating the County, either expressly or by implication, to exercise its power to levy taxes either to make payments to the District under this Agreement or to pay any judgment entered as a result of the County's breach of this Agreement. Nothing herein contained shall be construed either expressly or by implication as a pledge of the taxing power or full faith and credit of the County for the performance of this Agreement. County shall not be obligated to appropriate County funds for the obligation incurred hereunder except those water and sewer enterprise funds as herein specified.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the parties hereto have set their hand and seal by resolutions duly adopted by the governing board of the County and the Districts all on the day and year first above written.
