2020 Early Voting Plans for 2020 Election by Sheila Holloman, Director, Board of Elections

Board of Elections Director, Sheila Holloman, is participating in tonight's meeting to advise the Board of Commissioners of the latest plans related to one-stop voting sites for the upcoming presidential election.

The State Board of Elections has advised all local boards to accommodate as many voting sites as possible. The sites being proposed for this year's election: Board of Elections Office in Windsor, the Lewiston-Woodville Fire Department in Lewiston-Woodville, and a site in the Town of Powellsville.

All health and safety precautions will be taken to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Bertie County Inspections has deemed that no more than twenty people should be inside each of these voting sites at one time to better adhere to social distancing guidelines.

Once the formal plan is approved, dates and hours for voting will be announced to the public.

Early voting is set to begin on/around October 15th. Interested citizens are still able to apply to become an election official by going online through the NC State Board of Elections.

Chair Wesson inquired about the process for absentee ballots. Ms. Holloman noted that a form was available on the County's website to request an absentee ballot. If the form is completed correctly, it will be processed by the Bertie County Board of Elections. Absentee ballots can be requested until October 27th, and must be returned by Election Day.

In conclusion, Chair Wesson requested that Ms. Holloman report back to the Board when a final plan was approved by the State Board of Elections.

All supporting documentation was submitted to the Board in tonight’s agenda packet, and is also available online through the County’s website.

Employee appreciation

Commissioner Bazemore recognized County employees who have continued to work throughout the pandemic even with small children, elderly parents, etc. She inquired if the COVID-19 money recently received by the County could be used to give a bonus to all County staff.

County Manager Vaughan noted that the new funding received would only be eligible for emergency response workers such as law enforcement and EMS.

After a short discussion, County Administration was encouraged to continue to research the possibilities of any new funding that could be passed down from the NC General Assembly which could be used for an across the board increase.

Invoice for Disaster Recovery Coordinator Services, Mid-East Commission

The Board briefly discussed past meetings, and noted that no one recalled this item being presented to the Board by the Mid-East Commissioner.

Emergency Services Director, Mitch Cooper, noted that there was a partnership presented to the Board with East Carolina University. At the time, Mr. Cooper noted that no funds were being obligated, and that this was simply a “bridge” between the County and ECU to update the County Emergency Operations Plan. The Plan was then used for a project of the length of a semester.

Mr. Cooper recalled that this was mostly a conversation piece, and that he had not committed the County to any costs. He mentioned that for \$10,000, he would like to see a new plan that can be ready to submit to the Board for approval instead of a set of suggested changes to the Plan.

There was interest from Commissioner Bazemore and Commissioner Trent to receive a presentation from the Mid-East Commission about when and where costs were discussed for this project. There was consensus for Mr. Buck to approach the Board with this matter at the August 3rd work session.

2020 NACo/NCACC Voting Delegates – virtual business meetings & conference

The Board reached consensus to have Chairman Ronald Wesson as the voting delegate for both the NACo Business Meeting, as well as the NCACC Voting delegate.

First read: proposed 2021 Commissioners meeting schedule, 2021 State Holiday schedule

Commissioner Bazemore proposed that June 19th (Juneteenth) be added to the County’s holiday schedule beginning in 2021. Commissioner Trent made a **MOTION** to add this holiday to the County’s local holiday schedule in addition to the NC State holiday schedule. Vice Chair Lee **SECONDED** the motion. The **MOTION PASSED** unanimously.

Commissioner Lee presented a couple of concerns with April 2021’s meeting dates which will be closely reviewed.

She noted that citizens could receive a free snow cone or similar item for coming out and speaking with Census Count Committee members, or Census takers.

There was some additional discussion about doing outreach at the local food banks in the County.

Commissioner Bazemore noted that it could be very beneficial for the County to host another virtual town hall with all town mayors to better encourage areas to keep completing their Census surveys.

Looking Ahead: County operations at the end of the extension of Phase 2

The Board received a copy of a memorandum that all Department Heads received this week discussing the safety precautions that are currently planned for reopening county offices.

Currently, the following is in place from Governor Cooper:

D. Section 1(G) of Executive Order No. 124 is amended and restated as follows:

“Duration. This Section shall remain in effect for one hundred (120) days, until 11:59 pm on July 29, 2020, unless rescinded or superseded by another applicable Executive Order; provided, however, that after that date, the provisions of this Section shall continue to apply to arrearages that accumulated while this Executive Order was in effect.”

Commissioners’ Reports (E)

Vice Chair Lee

Vice Chair Lee commended Renee Draper in Aulander for her new job opportunity in Hertford County. She also noted several concerns about the Hardentown and Rosemead convenience/trash sites, and felt that more work needed to be done to ensure these sites were always accessible to the public as needed. She mentioned two (2) occasions where a Republic Services employee was not present at their post upon the scheduling opening, and that several compactors are full at each site making it difficult for residents to drop off their trash.

She also discussed her recent Tri-County Airport Authority Board meeting where construction is still underway on the new terminal building. Furniture and fixtures are being discussed.

Commissioner Trent

Commissioner noted that he was asked to participate in a meeting with Roanoke Electric Cooperative. They gave a brief update about Roanoke Connect and that a new contractor had just been hired. No completion dates have been discussed thus far. Refueling stations are also being brainstormed for electric vehicles. Also, solar panels were briefly discussed. Roanoke Electric was also participating in water towers as hot spots for broadband in those nearby areas.

Commissioner Bazemore

Commissioner Bazemore noted that additional access to internet and broadband is so important, and that COVID-19 has really shown those in this county how important it is for students and citizens to have affordable internet options. The County's Economic Development Director, and Grant Writer/TGOW Project Manager, Robin Payne, are encouraged to seek grants to bring more internet options to the County. Lastly, she noted how the Bertie Beach farm path is in good shape.

Commissioner Atkins

Commissioner Atkins gave no remarks at this time.

Chair Wesson

Chair Wesson thanked all County employees for their service during the pandemic.

He also noted that several renovations were due to begin in the courthouse and Administration building.

Lastly, he noted that the new MCC President was due to present several new programs at the Bertie-Martin Community College Campus in Windsor.

County Manager's Reports (F)

Mr. Vaughan announced that the occupancy certificate had been received for the new Blue Jay Recreation Center. He also reported that sadly, the NC Works Career Center in Windsor closed permanently on June 30, 2020. There are alternative site options in Windsor that could be cheaper, and satellite options are being explored in both Powellsville and Lewiston-Woodville.

He also reminded the Board about the 10:00 AM Board work session on August 3rd. It will now be held in this location instead of at the Roanoke-Cashie River Center.

County Attorney's Reports (G)

County Attorney Smith reminder the Board about a needed Closed Session to discuss personnel matters.

Public Comments

Melissa Pasek requested an update about renovations to the Bertie County Humane Society.

Mr. Vaughan noted that the renovations for this project are still in the works and have been budgeted in this year's budget.

Gwen Bond-Williams discussed how she would like to see the Board host another Town Hall meeting with Commissioners, citizens, and County staff to better improve communications between citizens and their town officials.

Iris Liverman of Cooper Hill Road in Windsor came forward to express her concerns about alleged fraud relating to an unauthorized phone service. She also noted frequent occurrences of loud, "bomb" like noises as well as bright lights in the very near vicinity of her home. She stated that she felt as if she was being targeted. She also noted that she had contacted local authorities about these occurrences. In addition, she noted a visit from Water Department personnel that have made her feel that she was being improperly charged for water usage.

The Board will discuss this matter again on August 3rd.

CALL TO ORDER

Chair Wesson called the meeting to order.

INVOCATION & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Lee gave the Invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

BRIEF ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Chairman Wesson made a brief statement thanking various members of the County staff, religious organizations, and all of the State assistance and strike teams who have been serving Bertie County since the storm impacted our area about one (1) week ago.

All County staff were commended for their diligence and hard work.

Chairman Wesson noted that the work will continue to assist citizens during their time of need.

MORNING ROAD TORNADO/TROPICAL STORM ISAIAS

Emergency Services Director, Mitch Cooper, provided a lengthy update to the Board about recovery efforts.

He distributed a hand out containing all of the affected addresses with the majority centralized in the Cedar Landing Community.

There was some discussion about why Siloam Baptist Church was utilized as an Emergency Operations Center instead of Cedar Landing Baptist Church or St. Paul's Church. Mr. Cooper noted that due to the timing of this tornado (overnight), options were limited due to blocked roads, power outages, and other factors.

Siloam Baptist Church was utilized because they were with power, and could provide access to a large parking area for response vehicles and equipment, several large meeting spaces with power immediately available in the overnight hours. It was also easily accessible from a main highway.

Plans for outfitting Cedar Landing Baptist Church as a point of distribution (POD) site for essential supplies was also discussed in the earliest stages to ensure supplies would be available closer to the area most impacted. The POD site is in operation, but will close by the end of this week if there is not enough need for the items.

Mr. Cooper also discussed logistics about the teams still located in Bertie County, and that the time was near for the County to resume day to day operations in the recovery phase of this disaster. The Baptist on Mission are also conducting meal services, while Hearts with Hands is assisting at the County's Storm Relief Donation Center set to open this week.

The initial damage assessment was completed in just nine (9) hours with the assistance of the strike teams in place to assist the County.

He emphasized that temporary housing was a huge priority at this time, as well as getting donation items from the various donation points to those most in need. There is currently an option available for placing campers on County-leased land, but discussion is still needed to make this happen.

Debris removal was also briefly discussed, and more information on that is forthcoming.

The Board also asked various questions of two (2) representatives from North Carolina Emergency Management.

TGOW UPDATES – ROBIN PAYNE, PROJECT CONSULTANT

Grants Submitted

TGOW Project Manager Robin Payne reviewed each of the grants to be submitted for Phase I including information on match requirements.

A lengthy discussion ensued about the archeological resources at the site, as well as shoreline stabilization.

Commissioners proposed additional meetings to learn more about both initiatives.

Ms. Payne also briefly discussed the 2020-21 North Carolina Division of Coastal Management Public Beach and Coastal Waterfront Access (CAMA Grant). The grant amount would be \$146,772.

Ms. Payne reviewed each of the activities proposed to DCM for funding and reviewed a timeline for beginning Phase I work.

A public comment notice was issued on July 27, 2020 with informational materials available on the County website, in tonight's agenda packet, and on the County Facebook page.

Chairman Wesson gave an additional opportunity for new public comments to be submitted. No comments were received during this Public Comment period.

Ms. Payne then distributed a copy of 1 email comment from Bertie citizen, Scott Sauer, that was received in July.

After a brief discussion, Commissioner Tammy Lee made a **MOTION** for Bertie County to submit a grant application for the 2020-2021 NC Division of Coastal Management Public Beach and Coastal Waterfront Access (CAMA grant) in the amount of \$146,772. Commissioner Bazemore the **SECONDED** the motion. The **MOTION PASSED** unanimously after the roll call vote.

After an additional discussion, the Board came to a consensus to refrain from applying for the NC Resilient Coastal Communities program grant at this time.

RECESS

The Board took a brief 15-minute recess before returning to work through lunch.

Updated DSS salary schedule

Chair Wesson made a **MOTION** to approve the update DSS salary schedule per State protocol, as well as to update the County's salary schedule to reflect the same. Commissioner Trent **SECONDED** the motion. The **MOTION PASSED** unanimously after the roll call vote.

NC Rebuild – Disaster Recovery Funds – North Carolina Office of Resiliency & Recovery

A representative from NC Rebuild will be available to present at an upcoming Board meeting.

At this time, Chair Wesson briefly summarized the program as one that is available to citizens who received damages due to federally declared storms.

The program can provide funding for replacement construction as well as rehabilitation of damaged homes for those who own their homes as well as the land.

How to apply was also briefly discussed, and would not present additional burden on County staff as NC Rebuild could provide intake services over the phone or online.

More information about this program is forthcoming.

Second Draft: 2021 Commissioners Meeting Schedule, Local & State Holiday Schedule

County Manager Vaughan noted a couple of changes that were made since the first draft was submitted to the Board back in July.

No action was taken at this time, but the schedules will be present for a final time at an upcoming meeting.

At this time, Chair Wesson inquired if the Board would still like to host their regularly scheduled meeting on August 17th.

There was consensus that the Board was comfortable in cancelling the meeting on August 17th as storm recovery efforts continue.

Census 2020 Initiatives

Traci White, Census Liaison for the Census Count Committee, discussed the new Census deadline of September 31st, 2020. This is an additional change to the schedule. The previous deadline was the end of October.

She noted that funding would be needed if the County would like to consider a Census event where incentives could be provided during a promotional Census event.

Mrs. White also discussed the Census bus, and how it was originally intended for recruiting Census takers.

Chair Wesson wanted to see if we still had the opportunity to employ Bertie residents as Census takers so that way citizens may be more likely to open the door, and consider filling out the Census if they have not done so already.

The County's new Census representative was impressed with Bertie's progress thus far, and that response rate numbers may actually be higher than what appears online.

There were some conversations about enlisting the area church organizations to assist in promoting completion of the Census.

COVID Updates

- **State of the County**
- **Reopening of County facilities upon completion of newly extended Phase 2**
- **Ending of covering fees for online payments**

Current COVID-109 numbers were presented by County Manager Vaughan.

Mr. Vaughan reiterated that Phase 2 was extended until Friday, September 11th.

Commissioner Trent inquired if the moratorium on utility cut offs to which Mr. Vaughan clarified that it expired on July 31, 2020.

A discussion was also needed about whether or not the Board would like to extend the County's current policy of by appointment only services at all County buildings, as well as consider continuing convenience fees for water and tax bills.

There was consensus among the Board to keep County facilities under the current policy of being open to the public by appointment only until at least September 11, 2020.

Commissioner Trent made a **MOTION** to continue waiving convenience fees for water bills, but to cease covering the fees related to paying property tax bills online. Commissioner Bazemore **SECONDED** the motion. The **MOTION PASSED** in a 4-1 vote with Vice Chair Lee voting no.

There was also a short discussion about local area COVID-19 outbreaks.

Disaster Recovery Coordinator Services – Bryant Buck, Executive Director Mid-East Commission

Bryant Buck, as well as Lisa Williams, of the Mid-East Commission were present for this discussion.

The grant process was summarized, and discussed the background of this project which led to the issuance of an invoice for a Disaster Recovery Coordinator.

Some confusion is still apparent as to when the County committed to the \$10,000 fee for these services.

Part of the services provided included a full review of the County's Emergency Operations Plan.

Executive Director Buck also briefly summarized other grant opportunities that could become available soon related to the pandemic and storm response and recovery.

Several Board members noted that they would have expected this sort of financial commitment be presented to the entire Board in advance.

No conclusion about dispensing payment for this invoice was reached at this time.

CLOSED SESSION

Vice Chair Lee made a **MOTION** to go into Closed Session pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 143-318.11(a)(4) to discuss matters relating to the location or expansion of industries or other businesses in the area served by the public body, including agreement on a tentative list of economic development incentives that may be offered by the public body in negotiations. The action approves the signing of an economic development contract or commitment, or the action authorizing the payment of economic development expenditures, shall be taken in an open session. Commissioner Trent **SECONDED** the motion. The **MOTION PASSED** unanimously after the roll call vote.

Commissioner Trent made a **MOTION** to return to Open Session. Commissioner Bazemore **SECONDED** the motion. The **MOTION PASSED** unanimously.

OPEN SESSION

Prioritizing County Projects

County Manager Vaughan allowed the Commissioners the opportunity to discuss prioritizing County projects.

Some of the projects includes a cost living adjustment for all employees, the teacher housing initiative, furnishings for the new Cooperative Extension/Library facility, mandated upgrade in voting machines, courthouse clock renovations, etc.

Commissioner Bazemore also inquired if the Assistant County Manager position was budgeted into this year's budget, and the Board was informed that this is the case.

A brief discussion was also conducted about the Board become clearer about how the Bertie County Morning Road Tornado Relief Funds will be dispersed. Commissioner Bazemore noted that rumors were out there, and that the Board should be transparent.

It was decided that the local Tornado Relief funds will be used to help citizens with as much immediate assistance as the County can provide as it continues to work with State and Federal partners to address larger needs and long-range solutions.

Those who were most impacted will have first priority. Cash gift cards from the credit union will be used for disperse the funds as they do not impose any fees.

Donations can be made to the Relief Fund via PayPal by going to paypal.me/BertieStrong. A donation button is also available on the County's website.

This fund is the only County sanctioned and approved fund by the Bertie County Board of Commissioners for Tropical Storm Isaias and the Morning Road tornado.

Donations to the Relief Fund may also be made payable and mailed to Bertie County, ATTN: Bertie County Morning Road Tornado Relief Fund, PO Box 530, Windsor, NC 27983.

The Board noted that funds will be dispersed as long as new donations are being made for tornado and Tropical Isaias victims.

Financial & Audit Updates

Overview & Discussion of Priorities

The Board reviewed several documents provided by the Finance Officer, William Roberson.

There was also a lengthy discussion about the County's current fund balance. Efforts will continue to be made to secure a final copy of the latest audit. Arrangements will also soon be underway for the next audit scheduled to take place this fall.

SUBJECT: Settlement Reports for 2019-2020

REQUEST:

Request that the Board of Commissioners accept the preliminary settlement reports as required by North Carolina General Statute 105-373 (a)(1) and that the insolvents report be entered into the official minutes indicating persons who listed personal property but owned no real property and whose taxes remain unpaid for 2019-2020. Also request that both lists be recharged to the Tax Administrator for collections as delinquent taxes. Request the Board of Commissioners receive and accept 2019-2020 settlement report for real, personal and motor vehicle taxes.

BACKGROUND:

North Carolina General Statute 105-373 requires the Tax Collector (Tax Administrator) to provide a settlement report to the Board of Commissioners after July 1 and prior to being charged with the collections of the current year's taxes.

IMPLEMENTATION PLAN:

Jodie Rhea, Tax Administrator, will provide the report as required, and upon being recharged will proceed with the collections of all delinquent real and personal property taxes.

FINANCIAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

2019 unpaid real property:	\$237,754.14
2019 unpaid personal property:	\$44,949.85

The 2019 unpaid personal property list is considered the insolvents report.

RECOMMENDATION SUMMARY:

Motion to accept the preliminary reports as required by North Carolina General Statute 105-373 and to enter the insolvents list into the official minutes of the Board of Commissioners, to accept the settlement report of current and delinquent real and personal property taxes for 2019-2020, and by resolution recharge Jodie Rhea, Tax Administrator, with the collections of the delinquent real and personal property taxes.

§ 105-373. Settlements.

(a) Annual Settlement of Tax Collector. –

(1) Preliminary Report. – After July 1 and before he is charged with taxes for the current fiscal year, the tax collector shall make a sworn report to the governing body of the taxing unit showing:

- a. A list of the persons owning real property whose taxes for the preceding fiscal year remain unpaid and the principal amount owed by each person; and
- b. A list of the persons not owning real property whose personal property taxes for the preceding fiscal year remain unpaid and the principal amount owed by each person. (To this list the tax collector shall append his statement under oath that he has made diligent efforts to collect the taxes due from the persons listed out of their personal property and by other means available to him for collection, and he shall report such other information concerning these taxpayers as may be of interest to or required by the governing body, including a report of his efforts to make collection outside the taxing unit under the provisions of G.S. 105-364.) The governing body of the taxing unit may publish this list in any newspaper in the taxing unit. The cost of publishing this list shall be paid by the taxing unit.

(2) Insolvents. – Upon receiving the report required by subdivision (a)(1), above the governing body of the taxing unit shall enter upon its minutes the names of persons owing taxes (but who listed no real property) whom it finds to be insolvent, and it shall by resolution designate the list entered in its minutes as the insolvent list to be credited to the tax collector in his settlement.

(3) Settlement for Current Taxes. – After July 1 and before he is charged with taxes for the current fiscal year, the tax collector shall make full settlement with the governing body of the taxing unit for all taxes in his hands for collection for the preceding fiscal year.

a. In the settlement the tax collector shall be charged with:

1. The total amount of all taxes in his hands for collection for the year, including amounts originally charged to him and all amounts subsequently charged on account of discoveries;
2. All penalties, interest, and costs collected by him in connection with taxes for the current year; and
3. All other sums collected by him.

b. The tax collector shall be credited with:

1. All sums representing taxes for the year deposited by him to the credit of the taxing unit or receipted for by a proper official of the unit;
2. Releases duly allowed by the governing body;
3. The principal amount of taxes constituting liens on real property;
4. The principal amount of taxes included in the insolvent list determined in accordance with subdivision (a)(2), above;
5. Discounts allowed by law;
6. Commissions (if any) lawfully payable to the tax collector as compensation; and

7. The principal amount of taxes for any assessment appealed to the Property Tax Commission when the appeal has not been finally adjudicated.

The tax collector shall be liable on his bond for both honesty and faithful performance of duty; for any deficiencies; and, in addition, for all criminal penalties provided by law.

The settlement, together with the action of the governing body with respect thereto, shall be entered in full upon the minutes of the governing body.

- (4) Disposition of Tax Receipts after Settlement. – Uncollected taxes allowed as credits in the settlement prescribed in subdivision (a)(3), above, whether represented by tax liens held by the taxing unit or included in the list of insolvents, shall, for purposes of collection, be recharged to the tax collector or charged to some other person designated by the governing body of the taxing unit under statutory authority. The person charged with uncollected taxes shall:

- a. Give bond satisfactory to the governing body;
- b. Receive the tax receipts and tax records representing the uncollected taxes;
- c. Have and exercise all powers and duties conferred or imposed by law upon tax collectors; and
- d. Receive compensation as determined by the governing body.

(b) Settlements for Delinquent Taxes. – Annually, at the time prescribed for the settlement provided in subdivision (a)(3), above, all persons having in their hands for collection any taxes for years prior to the year involved in the settlement shall settle with the governing body of the taxing unit for collections made on each such year's taxes. The settlement for the taxes for prior years shall be made in whatever form is satisfactory to the chief accounting officer and the governing body of the taxing unit, and it shall be entered in full upon the minutes of the governing body.

(c) Settlement at End of Term. – Whenever any tax collector fails to succeed himself at the end of his term of office, he shall, on the last business day of his term, make full and complete settlement for all taxes (current or delinquent) in his hands and deliver the tax records, tax receipts, tax sale certificates, and accounts to his successor in office. The settlement shall be made in whatever form is satisfactory to the chief accounting officer and the governing body of the taxing unit, and it shall be entered in full upon the minutes of the governing body.

(d) Settlement upon Vacancy during Term. – When a tax collector voluntarily resigns, he shall, upon his last day in office, make full settlement (in the manner provided in subsection (c), above) for all taxes in his hands for collection. In default of such a settlement, or in case of a vacancy occurring during a term for any reason, it shall be the duty of the chief accounting officer or, in the discretion of the governing body, of some other qualified person appointed by it immediately to prepare and submit to the governing body a report in the nature of a settlement made on behalf of the former tax collector. The report, together with the governing body's action with respect thereto, shall be entered in full upon the minutes of the governing body. Whenever a settlement must be made in behalf of a former tax collector, as provided in this subsection (d), the governing body may deliver the tax receipts, tax records, and tax sale certificates to a successor collector immediately upon the occurrence of the vacancy, or it may make whatever temporary arrangements for the collection of taxes as may be expedient, but in

no event shall any person be permitted to collect taxes until he has given bond satisfactory to the governing body.

(e) Effect of Approval of Settlement. – Approval of any settlement by the governing body does not relieve the tax collector or his bondsmen of liability for any shortage actually existing at the time of the settlement and thereafter discovered; nor does it relieve the collector of any criminal liability.

(f) Penalties. – In addition to any other civil or criminal penalties provided by law, any member of a governing body of a taxing unit, tax collector, or chief accounting officer who fails to perform any duty imposed upon him by this section shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

(g) Relief from Collecting Insolvents. – The governing body of any taxing unit may, in its discretion, relieve the tax collector of the charge of taxes owed by persons on the insolvent list that are five or more years past due when it appears to the governing body that such taxes are uncollectible.

(h) Relief from Collecting Taxes on Classified Motor Vehicles. The board of county commissioners may, in its discretion, relieve the tax collector of the charge of taxes on classified motor vehicles listed pursuant to G.S. 105-330.3(a)(1) that are one year or more past due when it appears to the board that the taxes are uncollectible. This relief, when granted, shall include municipal and special district taxes charged to the collector. 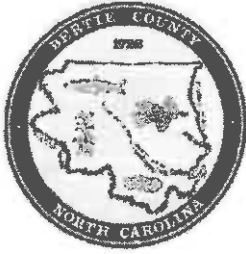

REQUEST:

In accordance with North Carolina General Statute 105-321(b), charge the Tax Administrator with the collection of taxes for the tax levy 2020-2021

BACKGROUND:

North Carolina General Statute 105-321(b) states that the Board of Commissioners shall adopt and enter into its minutes an order directing the Tax Collector (Tax Administrator) to collect the taxes charged in the tax records and receipts for the current fiscal year.

RECOMMENDATION SUMMARY:

Motion to charge Jodie Rhea, Tax Administrator, with the collections of all real, personal, and public service company taxes for the 2020-2021 levy year, and with the collections of all delinquent real, personal, public service company, and motor vehicle taxes.

SUPPORTING ATTACHMENTS:

North Carolina General Statute 105-321
Authorization to Collect

§ 105-321. Disposition of tax records and receipts; order of collection.

(a) County tax records shall be filed in the office of the assessor unless the board of county commissioners shall require them to be filed in some other public office of the county. City and town tax records shall be filed in some public office of the municipality designated by the governing body of the city or town. In the discretion of the governing body, a duplicate copy of the tax records may be delivered to the tax collector at the time he is charged with the collection of taxes.

(b) Before delivering the tax receipts to the tax collector in any year, the board of county commissioners or municipal governing body shall adopt and enter in its minutes an order directing the tax collector to collect the taxes charged in the tax records and receipts. A copy of this order shall be delivered to the tax collector at the time the tax receipts are delivered to him, but the failure to do so shall not affect the tax collector's rights and duties to employ the means of collecting taxes provided by this Subchapter. The order of collection shall have the force and effect of a judgment and execution against the taxpayers' real and personal property and shall be drawn in substantially the following form:

Such taxes are hereby declared to be a first lien upon all real property of the respective taxpayers in the County (or City or Town) of _____, and this order shall be a full and sufficient authority to direct, require, and enable you to levy on and sell any real or personal property of such taxpayers, for and on account thereof, in accordance with law.

(c) The original tax receipts, together with any duplicate copies that may have been prepared, shall be delivered to the tax collector by the governing body on or before the first day of September each year if the tax collector has made settlement as required by G.S. 105-352. The tax collector shall give his receipt for the tax receipts and duplicates delivered to him for collection.

(d) Repealed by Session Laws 2006-30, s. 5, effective June 29, 2006.

(e) The governing body of a taxing unit may contract with a bank or other financial institution for receipt of payment of taxes payable at par and of delinquent taxes and interest for the current tax year. A financial institution may not issue a receipt for any tax payments received by it, however. Discount for early payment of taxes shall be allowed by a financial institution that contracts with a taxing unit pursuant to this subsection to the same extent as allowed by the tax collector. A financial institution that contracts with a taxing unit for receipt of payment of taxes shall furnish a bond to the taxing unit conditioned upon faithful performance of the contract in a form and amount satisfactory to the governing body of the taxing unit. A governing body of a taxing unit that contracts with a financial institution pursuant to this subsection shall publish a timely notice of the institution at which taxpayers may pay their taxes in a newspaper having circulation within the taxing unit. No notice is required, however, if the financial institution receives payments only through the mail.

(f) Minimal Taxes. - Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 105-380, the governing body of a taxing unit that collects its own taxes may, by resolution, direct its assessor and tax collector not to collect minimal taxes charged on the tax records and receipts. Minimal taxes are the combined taxes and fees of the taxing unit and any other units for which it collects taxes, due on a tax receipt prepared pursuant to G.S. 105-320 in a total original principal amount that does not exceed an amount, up to five dollars (\$5.00), set by the governing body. The amount set by the governing body should be the estimated cost to the taxing unit of billing the taxpayer for the amounts due on a tax receipt or tax notice. Upon adoption of a resolution pursuant to this subsection, the tax

collector shall not bill the taxpayer for, or otherwise collect, minimal taxes but shall keep a record of all minimal taxes by receipt number and amount and shall make a report of the amount of these taxes to the governing body at the time of the settlement. These minimal taxes shall not be a lien on the taxpayer's real property and shall not be collectible under Article 26 of this Subchapter. A resolution adopted pursuant to this subsection must be adopted on or before June 15 preceding the first taxable year to which it applies and remains in effect until amended or repealed by resolution of the taxing unit. A resolution adopted pursuant to this subsection shall not apply to taxes on registered motor vehicles.

(g) Minimal Refunds. - The governing body of a taxing unit that collects its own taxes may, by resolution, direct the taxing unit not to mail a refund for an overpayment of tax if the refund is less than fifteen dollars (\$15.00). Upon adoption of a resolution pursuant to this subsection, the taxing unit shall keep a record of all minimal refunds by receipt number and amount and shall make a report of the amount of these refunds to the governing body at the time of the settlement and shall implement a system by which payment of the refund may be made to a taxpayer who comes into the office of the taxing unit seeking the refund. Unless the taxpayer requests the minimal refund in person at the office of the taxing unit before the end of the fiscal year in which the refund is due, the taxing unit must implement a system to apply the minimal refund as a credit against the tax liability of the taxpayer for taxes due to the taxing unit for the next succeeding year. An overpayment of tax bears interest at the rate set under G.S. 105-241.21 from the date the interest begins to accrue until a refund is paid or applied in accordance with this section. Interest accrues from the later of the date the tax was paid and the date the tax would have been considered delinquent under G.S. 105-360. A resolution adopted pursuant to this subsection must be adopted on or before June 15 preceding the first taxable year to which it applies and remains in effect until amended or repealed by resolution of the taxing unit. Bertie County:

ECU Fundamentals of Emergency Management class completed a semester long review of Bertie County's Emergency Operation Plan. Due to meeting restrictions the revised plan was presented to Bertie County by the student groups via Zoom in March. When meeting restrictions are relaxed a presentation to the Bertie County Commissioners will be scheduled. This project has proven to be a much needed, valuable, and well received effort for Bertie County as they

plan and prepare for the current hurricane season and future disaster response and recovery. Lisa and Mitch Cooper, Bertie Emergency Manager, participated in class discussion on the campus of ECU on January 16th to meet the students and kick off the project. Lisa then worked with the four students groups meeting three times with each group to review and discuss their sections of the plan and reviewing and submitting comments on the final draft prior to its presentation ECU faculty and Bertie County on May 30th.

☑Lisa will be submitting an application in July to Nominate Mid East and the ECU partnership for the NADO 2020 Impact Award for the Bertie County EOP project.

☑A property site visit December 20th to a home on Sally Freeman Rd. for potential storm related repairs lead to a referral to the Bertie County Department of Social Services / Senior Services. From that discussion with the director a plan was made to schedule a series of public preparedness campaigns in partnership with BCDSS. As those conversations were starting in February the travel restrictions in March have delayed that project. It is hoped to continue those in the coming weeks and to move forward.

☑It was also brought to my attention that the Town of Colerain had a need for funding to make repairs to their community building. I reached out to the town manager for more details and cost estimates. I have not received that documentation and will continue to follow up.

☑A funding opportunity is available for repairs to properties that are listed on the National Register of Historic Properties. Next week Lisa will be forwarding that information out to our counties and municipalities with an offer of assistance should they chose to apply. It is noted that some of our municipalities rely on the historic preservation of their town as a draw for tourism. Repairing these properties from storm damage and maintaining their presence as part of the overall aesthetic of the town is a factor in tourist dollars and economic stability. There are properties in Bertie County that may benefit from these funds.

☑Discussions are ongoing with both Federal and State organizations for a solution to the lack of affordable, single family homes in Bertie County. Bertie County has lost much of its affordable housing and rental property to flooding. A discussion with NC Finance this week has opened a possible new avenue of funding. Solving this challenge would be the first step in bringing economic growth to Bertie County and filling job vacancies at the Bertie County Correctional Institute.

MID-EAST COMMISSION- ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION
HURRICANE FLORENCE RECOVERY GRANT

The Mid-East Commission received a \$200,000 grant from the Economic Development Administration on April 4, 2019. The purpose of the grant is to hire a Disaster Recovery Coordinator to support Hurricane Florence disaster recovery efforts and provide technical assistance. The coordinator will work with communities to build resource capacity and assess the needs of the region to better plan for and respond to future disasters. The project will enable Beaufort, Bertie and Pitt Counties become more economically resilient in the face of future disasters and spur business and social redevelopment in the region.

There is a \$50,000 match required. The Commission is approaching each County (Beaufort, Bertie and Pitt) and three Electric Cooperatives to help fund the match. Specifically, Mid-East is requesting \$10,000 from each County as their part of the match for the project.

Below are some examples of the activities that the Disaster Recovery Coordinator will be working on.

Proposed Scope of Work

The Disaster Recovery activities will focus on the following items:

1. Mapping of storm water infrastructure, etc. and providing community storm water management education.
2. Collaborate with local, state and federal partners to assess damages in the three county region.
3. Partner with ECU to ensure recovery activities each entity is engaged in is leveraged and collaborative to have greatest impact.
4. Work as a liaison between agencies, partners and local governments to help identify resources and facilitate coordination of activities/resources and assets.
5. Incorporate CEDS into hazard mitigation planning through strategies that support resiliency and recovery.
6. Review of local ordinances for consistency with principals of resiliency.
7. Identify needs, evaluate and locate possible resources to address them.
8. Provide grant application preparation services for potential projects.
9. Work to update recovery plans for affected areas where already in place and assist with development of recovery plans for severely impacted communities that do not have them.
10. Attend and facilitate meetings of key players.
11. Develop/distribute materials for businesses and individuals to help them prepare for and recover from natural disasters.
12. Assist local governments with special projects they perceive as critical to promote recovery/ resiliency in their respective jurisdictions.
13. Identify ways and assist local governments to better prepare for disasters and assist with planning that will help them endure, respond to, and eventually recover from disasters.

Bertie County

Reviewing and Updating the County Emergency Operations Plan (EOP): The plan was written in 2004 and last updated in 2009. Since that time Bertie County has experienced multiple events prompting them to activate the plan in part or in whole on several occasions. These activations have at times included the activation of the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and/or the opening of evacuation shelters, some have expanded to include mutual aid in the form of local, state and federal resources. These events have brought an awareness to Bertie Emergency Services for the need of a comprehensive review of their current plan. It is anticipated that this review process will take six months to complete and will deliver to Bertie County a thoroughly updated EOP incorporating lessons learned into the plans policies and procedures. The first planning meeting has been held. I have started the process of getting log in credentials for Bertie County's E-Plan. This will allow me to work on the plan changes that we have discussed.

Special Needs Registry: There is currently no system in place to identify and target specific communication with or provide post event accountability of the special needs population in the county. I have been asked by the county Emergency Manager and County Manager to reach out to the county Director of Social Services and discuss the need for a registry and the steps needed to implement it in the county. I will be requesting a meeting with the DSS Director for their input and guidance.

Shelter Needs: There are three school facilities in the county that are used for evacuation sheltering. I was alarmed to learn that not one of them have a generator. I would like to see at least one if not all three equipped with a generator. Red Cross has also become very short staffed and their assistance in opening shelters is taking longer and longer to arrive. The man/women power to move supplies to the shelter is delaying the ability to start accepting evacuees into the shelter. I asked short of generators and volunteers what would help them the most in getting the shelters open as quickly and efficiently as possible. They presented to me an option of pre staging three shelter PODS. Shelter PODS (Point of Distribution) is basically a rolling cart/rack that has blankets, basic medical supplies, sleeping mats, MRE's, intake forms and signage, etc. for up to 50 people. The availability of a POD would allow the shelter to open quickly with basic supplies and to function until more supplies are available. The PODS vary in price, depending on the items selected, from \$700 to \$2500.

Community Preparedness Outreach: Materials have been ordered and received. It has been discussed to reach out to corporate sponsors for a series of community outreach events with a focus on winter/cold weather safety, tornado awareness and hurricane preparedness. These efforts will be coordinated with Emergency Services and the Emergency Manager.

Hurricane Dorian: I have reached out to Emergency Services to offer support in the recovery process.

EDA Grants & Other Funding Sources: Assisting in identifying, researching and developing improvement, resiliency, and recovery grants from various sources to improve the quality of life and economic health of Bertie County.

Funding Forum: A Funding Forum was held August 28, from 1 to 4 on the campus of ECU. This was a joint effort between Mid-East Commission and others to bring together funding partners and county and municipal representation. There were approximately 85 attendees and 8 presenters.

5. The County Manager is authorized to discard any personal property that is remaining after the auction sale that he determines has no value, pursuant to 160A-266.
